
How Plants Grow [10-02]

Hi, Andy! I'm your plant. I'm not growing well. Do you know why? You don't give me enough water and sun.
You gave me soil to grow in. Only soil is not enough. I also need both water and sun! Sun and water give energy to my roots and leaves. The green color in my leaves makes the food. I live and grow with the food. Give me both water and sun, and I will be a healthy plant!

How do I grow with water and sun? I have three parts in my body — leaves, **trunks**, and roots. My leaves make

food. My roots **take in** water from the soil. Then the water goes from the roots to the trunk. The trunk sends the water out to the leaves. My roots and trunk also **hold** me **up**. So, I don't fall down!

My friend **cactus** needs just a little water. Too much water is bad for a cactus. I have another friend, **moss**. It lives in the **shade**. It doesn't need lots of sun. Remember, all plants need three things — water, sun, and soil. But every plant needs a different **amount**. 1 What three things do plants need to grow?


