How are the houses at the North Pole different from your house?

Tina's Igloo



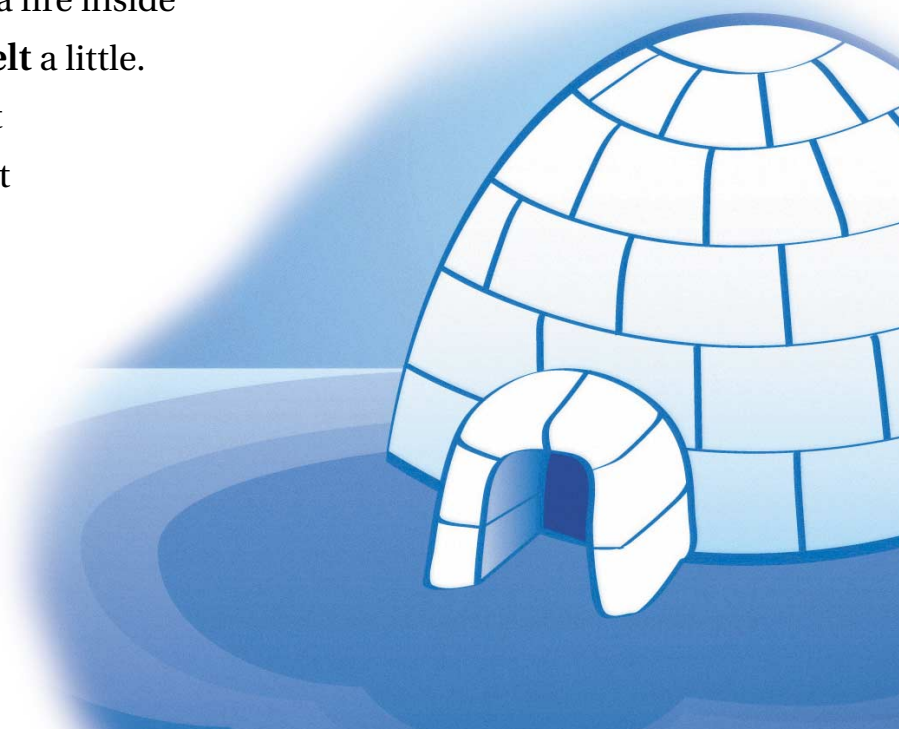
Hi! I am Tina. I live at the North Pole. People often call us “Eskimos.” But we do not call ourselves Eskimos. We call ourselves “Inuit.” Inuit means “people” in our language. Our land is very cold. So we build **igloos**, or round snow houses, to stay warm in the cold weather.

We build igloos with **blocks** of heavy snow. Igloos have a window, a door, and a hole to get fresh air. Igloos can be big or small. Sometimes we make a big igloo out of two or three little igloos. We make tunnels between the little igloos. Then we have a big igloo!

Can we feel warm inside igloos? Yes. Igloos are warm inside. Sometimes it is 20 degrees inside, even when it is minus 40 **degrees** outside!

This is because an igloo's snow walls do not lose heat. Snow has power to keep heat inside.

People have a little lamp or make a fire inside igloos. The snow of igloos may **melt** a little. But the snow **freezes** again, and it makes igloos strong. So, they don't melt away, and we can stay warm.

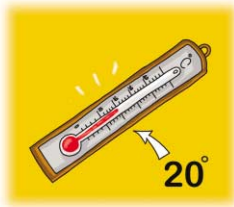
