


EXAMPLE Do you want to write about animals? Think of IDEAS about them.





FOCUSING THE TOPIC

Sometimes a topic is too big. You cannot write all about it. You need to focus on a STRONG IDEA. To find a STRONG IDEA:


- pick a topic you know a lot about.

EXAMPLE Here we start with a big topic and make it into a STRONG IDEA.



D ADDING DETAILS TO THE TOPIC

DETAILS make your writing come alive. More information will create vivid pictures in your reader's mind. Use your memories, imagination and other sources of information for DETAILS. Make sure your DETAILS are important to your main topic.

EXAMPLE "I went for a walk."




