About TEPS / 텔스의 개요 /

TEPS (Test of English Proficiency developed by Seoul National University)는 서울대학교에서 개 발되고 텝스관리위원회에 의해 시행되는 공인인증 영어시험입니다. 매월 실시되며 응시자들의 취업. 입학 등 을 위한 영어 능력 측정에 있어 귀중한 평가 자료가 됩니다.

시험은 네 개의 영역(청취, 문법, 어휘, 독해)으로 구성되며, 총 200문항으로 990점 만점입니다. 각 영역마다 엄격한 제한 시간이 있으며, 세부 사항은 다음과 같습니다.

Reading Comprehension in TEPS

TEPS의 R/C (Reading Comprehension)는 신문, 잡지, 대학 교양과목 개론 등에서 찾아볼 수 있는 교양 있는 수준의 글 및 서신, 광고, 홍보, 지시문, 설명문 등의 실용적인 글을 이해하는데 요구되는 총체적인 독해 력을 측정하고자 한다. 따라서 학술적인 내용 뿐 아니라 비전문적 학술문, 실용문에 이르기까지 독해 지문의 소재를 균형 있게 다루고 있는 시험이다.

Part I 빈칸 넣기 (16 문제)

적게는 50~60 단어에서 많게는 100 단어가 넘는 단락의 글을 읽고, 그 안의 빈칸에 들어갈 알맞은 표현을 고르는 문항이다. 글의 중심 생각이나 글 전체의 흐름을 파악하여 문맥상 빈칸에 가장 알맞은 어구나 연결어를 4지선다의 선 택지에서 골라야 한다. 빈칸은 지문의 마지막에 있는 경우가 많으며, 지문의 앞이나 중간에도 종종 등장한다.


